

Where are we going? – Agroforestry Through the Looking Glass

Abstract

After 40 years it seems surprising that policy makers still don't see agroforestry as the appropriate farming system for mainstream agriculture in the tropics and sub-tropics. It's not that we haven't made progress through our research. So, why has recognition been so slow? Reflecting on my experience of agroforestry over the last 25 years, I think we have difficulty communicating what is an intricate, multi-faceted, multi-disciplinary subject that can be delivered using hundreds of different species in infinitely variable configurations across a wide range of geographies. This makes it extremely hard to explain to people who come from very different backgrounds; often with very different mindsets and viewpoints. I will try to offer some guidance by examining some principles.
